Robotics

Science Olympiad

The Science Olympiad competition is based on science driven activities. There are numerous activities that are available to students who participate. This includes Life, Personal & Science, Earth and Space Science, Physical Science & Chemistry, Technology & Engineering, and Inquiry & Nature of Science. Most categories are in an assessment format. Participants go around to different stations answering questions or take an assessment about the category they are participating in. Some activities are building activities where you will use engineering, problems solving, and prompted thinking to plan, construct, test, reflect, improve, and write down data about a structure or vehicle. As of right now there is one team, there are at most 15 people per team.


